The ILO estimates that annually 2.34 million people in the world die from work-related accidents and diseases. From these fatalities, the majority of 2.02 million are related to occupational and work- related diseases. It is estimated around 160 million workers suffer from non-fatal work-related diseases which are preventable. Besides causing immeasurable human suffering to victims and their families, such diseases cause major economic losses for enterprises and society, including reduced productivity and work capacity. Around 4 percent of the world's gross domestic product (GDP) is lost due to work-related accidents and diseases in direct and indirect costs.

With an unprecedented economic development and industrial growth, wide range of materials, equipment and chemicals are brought into the workplace - some of which are hazardous to the health and safety of workers. The Ministry of Labour and Human Resources aspires to transform Bhutan into a nation with safe, healthy and happy working environment free from exposure to occupational hazards. The Ministry has been endeavoring
