



be offered through four board sub programs:

- 1) Youth Engagement Program (YEP);
- 2) Employment Support Program (ESP);
- 3) Project Specific Program (PSP); and,
- 4) Skills Training Program (SP).

During the launch the Department signed Memorandum of Understanding with the Construction Development Corporation Limited (CDCL), Pyelber Lokchey Nyamchoe Laydey (PLNL) and Youth Group of Panbang to engage the youth through this program. Around 1,500 job seekers will be supported under the program annually. The program was developed based on the findings on the impact of Direct Employment Scheme, carried out jointly by the GNHC and the ministry. Looking at the effectiveness of the program, GNHC recommended the ministry to make it more engaging and inclusive. The Department of Employment of Human Resources (DoEHR) has initiated acceptance of vacancies from different employers choice if they get a working visa. for engagement under YELP.

which has been designed in direct collaboration with the Japanese government will allow our Bhutanese youth to pursue internships with Japanese employers to gain skills and knowledge for their employability. The internship is also expected to result in the transfer of skills, technologies, and knowledge to the Bhutanese youth which will culminate in the capacity development of Bhutanese people.

The youth will be placed for three years of internships in various implementing organizations in Japan with a possible extension of up to five years. The employing agencies will pay a stipend, facilitate the accommodation and logistics for youth during the internship. After the internship, beneficiaries are expected to return home to join the labour market in the similar sectors of their engagement. The Ministry expects youth to bring back critical skills in filling the job vacancies at home. However, they can also choose to work in Japan through their own


